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Ritual Performance, Cosmology, and Identity of the Balinese:

A Study of Barong

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ABSTRACT

The research as presented here is a pilot version of proposal, entitled, Performance, Cosmology, and Identity of Balinese: Study of Barong". The research attempts to explore and interpret the semiotics of Barong Dance by applying the methods of ethnographic the theories of particular traditional media. The research begins with the analysis of the structure of the Barong Dance, the Barong belief system, vision and cultural space in the context of social, economic and political life of Balinese communities. The expected results of the research are the identification of the concept of Dualism and the balance of power relations in Balinese cosmology, as being basic philosophies of system traditional reflected in the key "signs"; masks and costumes. The research findings lead to the hypothesis that Balinese communities, which inherited the Barong past today, may relationship with the community structure seen as a clan system. The sacred rituals of the Barong and Rangda masks obviously reflect the Balinese belief presence of Déities as representation ancestral spirits and animistic beliefs, are related to unconsciousness and to archetypes which portray the depth-psyche of mankind, commun story, characters,

Furthermore, the research attempts to study the identity formation of Barong Dance which was formulated to satisfy current social and psychological needs and has become an invented tradition to cope with present-day cultural tourism.

Intensive research in at least three Balinese communities is planned for a comparative study in order to justify the research assumptions. The study expects to prove that the assumptions regarding the interpretation of the dualistic belief system, its and concept of archetypal including the relationship to Balinese clan system are accurate. It is estimated that, through times and changes, Barong dance in situation is not just used for communication with the deities as tráditional medium, but it hides the mechanism of the **Balinese** archetypes globalization. Also patterns of **Balinese** the in each anticipated that these in-depth hidden structures traced and tracked only psychological and anthropological approaches. For accuracy and concord findings, an interdisciplinary participatory research, intensive fieldwork, and postmodern application need to be conducted.
